Production Employees Design New Workstation for Ag Equipment Assembly

On January 7, Pioneer began work on a part for the launch of a new Flex Wing rotary cutter for Tarter USA and John Deere. This manufacturing partnership between the two industry leaders offers the development and production of a new

line of American-made rotary cutters under the “Frontier” brand. After review of the prototype parts, two employees took the initiative to see to it that a new workstation and fixtures were created to facilitate assembly of 6 new style chain guard frames.

Pre-production samples were sent to Tarter and passed first article inspection. All 6 new parts are currently in full production. 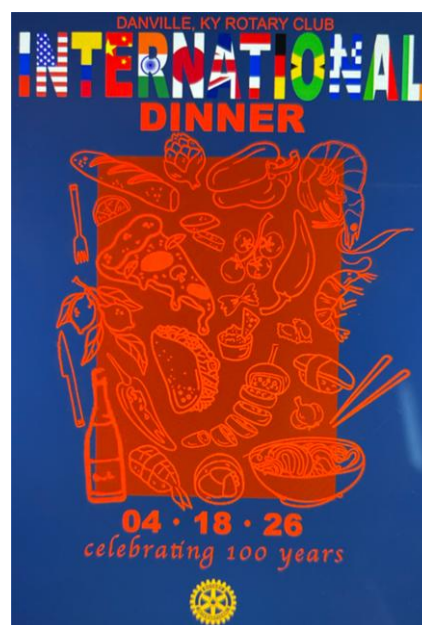
